- Absorbed: deeply interested or involved; preoccupied.
- Animation: animated quality; liveliness; vivacity; spirit.
- Awkwardly: lacking skill or dexterity.
- Bewildered: completely puzzled or confused; perplexed.
- Bickering: to engage in a petulant or peevish argument.
- Blackmail: and payment extorted by intimidation, as by threats of injurious revelations or accusations.
- Bolt: a movable bar or rod that when slid into a socket fastens a door.
- Canal: an artificial water way for navigation, irrigation, etc.
- Cellar: a room, or set of rooms, for the storage of food, fuel, water, etc., wholly or partially underground and usually beneath a building.
- Coeducational: educating both sexes jointly at the same time at the same institution or classes.
- Compassionate: having or showing compassion.
- Contracts: an agreement between two or more parties for the doing or not doing of something specified.
- Cultured: enlightened; refined.
- Dignified: characterized or marked by dignity of aspect or manner; stately; decorous.
- Ideals: a conception or idea of something in its perfection.
